LEARNING OBJECTIVES (II. Post-Myocardial Infarction Risk Reduction):

- To examine the various interventions and strategies for reducing cardiovascular risk following myocardial infarction. These interventions include medications, life-style changes, diet, cardiac rehabilitation and devices.
- To increase awareness of the available therapies and to encourage wider use of these life-saving interventions.
- To highlight the role of the members of the health care team in identifying patients for treatment of post myocardial infarction and in initiating therapies in collaboration with a cardiologist.
- To examine current practices of initiating risk-reduction therapies at discharge from the hospital.
- After attending this session, participants will be able to:
 - a. Identify patients at high risk for cardiovascular events following myocardial infarction.
 - b. Provide a plan of risk reduction involving medications, exercise and device therapy.
 - c. Begin risk reduction strategies in a hospital setting or in the office.
