Exit ramp leads onto Ditmars Blvd. Follow Ditmars Blvd. for 1/2 mile around traffic circle to hotel on the right side. **Long Island- L.I.** Expwy. (495) to Grand Central Pkwy. to Exit 7 (94th St.). Make left at next two lights, follow Ditmars Blvd. for 1/2 mile around traffic circle to hotel on the right side. **Brooklyn -** Belt Pkwy. to Van Wyck Expwy. (north) to Grand Central Pkwy.(west) to Exit 7 (94th St.). Make left at next two traffic lights, follow Ditmars Blvd. for 1/2 mile around traffic circle.
