Educational Objectives for Pharmacists:

- 1 – List the medication warnings and signals that can be integrated into Computerized Physician Order Entry (CPOE), the pharmacy interface, and Medication Administration Checking (MAC) to reduce med errors.
- 2 – Describe how to use CPOE to significantly increase physician adverse drug event reporting.
- 3 – Describe how to use MAC to significantly increase detecting and reporting medication errors
- 4 – Describe how to utilize CPOE and the pharmacy interface to improve medication distribution services and redeploy pharmacists to provide bedside clinical pharmacy care services.
- 5 – Describe how to utilize CPOE and the pharmacy interface to design successful antibiotic restriction programs, non-formulary medication management, pharmacokinetic consultations, renal dosing programs, pregnancy/lactation restrictions, medication reports, and pharmacist intervention documentation programs.

- 2 – List the types of medication errors that can be prevented by using CPOE.
- 3 – Describe how barcoded MAC prevents medication errors.
